SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- The project album must be uploaded to Atap.co prior to filling in the submission form.
- Supported image file types are jpeg, png, gif, tiff and bmp. Each image must be under 25 MB in size. High-resolution images are recommended.
- Images should not contain logos, watermarks, or texts of any kind. Collages are not permitted.
- Project submissions must include high-resolution images and a clear floor plan
- Project entries should incorporate a concise description of the concept.

PROJECT CATEGORY JUDGING CRITERIA

JUDGING CRITERIA

A detailed written material/ description of the project is required for each project submission alongside floor plans of the project, showcasing the spatial layout and arrangement of key elements within the space.

Your project will be judged based on the judging criteria below. The judges will give scores with the following prompts using a scale of 0-10 (O Strongly Disagree - 10 Strongly Agree). Use the instructions as your guide to score maximum points in each submission.

Design Vision & Concept (25%)

The overall design should be judged based on well-planned and thoughtful use of design curated to achieve a successful outcome design statement.

- 1. The design concept is clearly presented and visualised.
- 2. The design creates a remarkable first impression that can serve as an inspiration to the community.
- 3. The design will leave a positive and long-lasting impact by elevating the well-being of the occupants.

Aesthetic Qualities (25%)

This category should be judged by the overall visual appeal and aesthetics.

- 1. The project is well-executed and presents the aesthetic concepts successfully.
- 2. The design has creatively utilised colours, appropriate materials and design outputs.
- 3. The property is enhanced by the interior upgrades using a good balance of design strategies.

Functionality & Practicality (20%)

This category should be judged based on aspects created through design to deliver the most positive impact on the occupants in terms of feasibility and ease of use.

- 1. The design is conceptualised with the needs of all occupants in mind and was clearly followed through in the execution.
- 2. The design takes into consideration real-world functionalities that can transform the versatility of the space for all occupants.
- 3. The project fulfils its practical purpose while also creating a sense of enjoyment and satisfaction.

Innovation & Originality (20%)

This category should be judged by the ingenuity and potential impact of the project, taking into account the ability to deliver innovative and forward-driven designs.

- 1. The design is original in its execution.
- 2. The project has successfully applied new and innovative design ideas.
- 3. The project displays a refreshing and creative approach to the routine role that is designed to stand the test of time.

Environmental Sustainability (10%)

This category should be judged on design features that have a long-term environmental impact and the effective use of sustainable materials.

- 1. The project incorporates sustainable and eco-friendly elements into the design.
- 2. The project successfully paired good design with durability in mind which impacts the environment by producing less waste in the long run.
- 3. These sustainable aspects fit seamlessly into the design and functionality of the overall project.





JUDGING CRITERIA

ADA BEST DESIGN CONCEPT (RESIDENTIAL) ADA BEST DESIGN CONCEPT (COMMERCIAL)

These categories accept entries in 3D rendering only

Design Vision & Concept (20%):

This category is judged on candidates' capacity to articulate a strong design vision and develop innovative concepts, emphasising originality, coherence, and effective communication.

- 1. Ensures coherence between design vision, project purpose, context, and expectations.
- 2. Maintains consistency in design language, aesthetic principles, and narrative themes.

Originality & Innovation (30%):

This category evaluates participants' originality and innovation in design, emphasising their ability to push creative boundaries and introduce fresh ideas.

- 1. Designs presented stand out, with original concepts diverging from the norm.
- 2. Projects explore unconventional ideas or themes, inspiring innovative design solutions.

Visual Presentation & Communication (20%):

This category judges participants' visual presentation and communication skills in conveying design concepts, emphasising clarity and impact.

- 1. Utilises advanced techniques for photorealistic image production, effectively communicating the design vision.
- 2. Demonstrates precise detailing of interior elements, furnishings, and finishes in visualisations.

Future Potential & Adaptability (20%):

This category judges the potential for future growth and adaptability of the design project, focusing on its ability to respond to trends and technologies within the industry

- 1. Considers how the design concept can adapt to various contexts, scales, and project requirements.
- 2. Allows for future modifications based on evolving user needs, technology, or trends.

Technical Proficiency & Detailing (10%):

This category evaluates the technical proficiency and attention to detail demonstrated in participants' design projects.

- 1. Ensures precision in depicting project elements, spatial proportions, and building details as per design specifications.
- 2. Innovative visualisation techniques, such as augmented reality, virtual reality, or interactive presentations, are employed in the rendering process.
